Romans 12:1-2 We are to be different than the world

Romans 12:3-8 We are to seek the good of others above our own

Romans 12:9-21 We are to foster mutual love and no vengeance within the Body

Romans 13:1-7 We are to have a positive contribution to community life including our submission to governing authorities.

Romans 13:8-14 We are to love our neighbors and put off the works of darkness—walk uprightly

Romans 14:1-15:13 We are not to judge or condemn the “freedoms” or lack of freedoms individual Christians practice. In areas that are not right or wrong, we must show concern for the individual not the practice, seeking to develop and maintain unity.
